Out of the Silence

Out of the Silence

The work of Healing Touch is growing and blossoming into a song that is being heard throughout the world.

From hospital rooms in Colorado, to a world renowned health spa and health and education fair for US Veterans and American Indian Veterans in Arizona, to volunteers helping with our 2010 conference in St. Louis, to healing prayers for Haiti and Chile where our teachers and students reside, to nursing schools in Taiwan, to healing centers in India and workshops in Zimbabwe, the voice of Healing Touch is clear and strong. The theme for this issue of HTI's Perspectives in Healing is "Out of the Silence". It was inspired by a song by Jan Garret and is exemplified by the stories of our many voices creating a huge light and sound harmonic as we are touched personally and touch others in turn. These world voices sang for my personal family in 2007 and inspired this theme that we share today.

Healing at the Borderland between Zones 7 and 9

It was a very busy Emergency Room that Sunday night in the spring of 2007. Eight hours of testing, emergency intervention and stabilization for physical and emotional shock was followed by weeks of critical care in the hospital that year, the next year and the last. Witness, coach, mother, healer, nurse, praying woman and advocate, I often slept in a little chair by the bedside. Other times I was gifted with a small and blessed roll-away cot. It had a dip in it, much like a hollowed out canoe. It conformed to my body and suspended me within the hospital room. We were suspended at this borderland between zones 7 and 9 within the never-never land of the hospital....... we were suspended in time, in space, between illness and healing, hope and hopelessness, physical life and non-life, between the phoenix burning and rising again.

Center, focus, ground, and breathe. These were the words and actions that kept panic at bay. Over the next 3 years, there were moments of hope and respite, points of light and breath within what seemed like interminable periods of hopelessness and suffering. There were hospitalizations too numerous to count, bills too large to comprehend, and dark nights of the soul when one questions the very existence of all things.

There was the high tech expertise, skills and compassion of the multi-layered health care team. And there was the **rolling OM** of the energy practitioners from around the world; those who held us in prayer upon arising and retiring, those who sat and worked with us in the borderland, those who sent light from the heartland and those who

sent healing from the southern hemisphere of Asia as the sun was setting here in Colorado. They did this from their great hearts, without fanfare or expectation of personal gain. It was often during these times of literal darkness and perceived isolation, that we discovered renewed hope and light as we received the energy waves from our colleagues. Our gratitude is beyond description, for all the healers, both Western and complementary.

Out of the Silence: At one point during this journey, we were facing the deadline for publication of this newsletter. There were few submissions and it was a true creative desert experience for me. I considered publishing a very small newsletter with numerous blank pages and asking our readers to contemplate the white paper and quiet. A colleague asked me what I needed personally at that moment and I responded "silence". She told me to write about it and I have included that writing in this publication.

Shortly after that writing, I returned home to get fresh clothing to take back to the hospital. I opened one of my travel CD cases and chanced upon Jan Garret's Gypsy CD purchased at our 2005 HTI conference in Breckenridge after Jan and her husband JD Martin performed at our banquet. As I was pulling into our driveway, the song "Out of the Silence" began to play; I had never heard it before. It touched a deep place within my heart and energy and became another pathway of healing and opening for this borderland experience. As that flow opened, comfort and light had even more space to enter. Even now, recalling the music, this happens to my heart chakra, like Tonglen practice and Flashing Heart Openness. That coupled with the rolling OM of energy, assured me that hope and light was in the world and would prevail.

The Background Story: I shared this experience and awareness with Jan and JD, along with the writing on Silence. She in return shared the following wonderful story that goes along with the writing of that song:

"My twin daughters were about 9 or 10, and 1 was collaborating with several women in Aspen to create a kids' play on the environment for a summer festival here. The story line was the typical good guy (green) vs. bad guy (grey) scenario, and we got stuck as to what might turn the plot to a good conclusion without being too obvious or corny. What we came up with (and this was a direct reflection of larger societal conflicts in real life) was that the issues were all so complicated we couldn't really tie it up into

Honoring Janet Mentgen Healing Touch International Founder

Janet Mentgen founded HTI and we honor her vision of Spreading Healing Light Worldwide with HTI Day on March 6th, the day that Janet, as President, filed the HTI papers to create it. She trained us to follow her mission and vision for HTI as well as do the Healing Touch work which is to "go forth 7 generations" and into every household. It is to become a household word. We are getting closer, but more is to be done.

I trained with Janet for 6 weeks the spring and early summer before her passing as she encouraged us to carry on the work as she envisioned it and to take it beyond her to the next levels. It is important that we maintain "laser focus", as Myra Tovey received in a dream about Janet a few years ago, ignoring the distractions, and staying the course. Janet never wanted to be a guru, and was clear to remind us that "it is about the work, not about ego or the personality, to keep the focus on Healing Touch."

Workings of the Non-Profit Model

In HTI, a non-profit organization and model, we work in a volunteer collective of committees and boards as team players. The focus must always be on the greatest good for the whole, because the rules are that no one can benefit individually from a non-profit. The revenue that comes in serves the whole and rolls back into the organization to provide service, tools and support rather than profit to owners, because there aren't "owners".

Our office staff is small and so we rely upon and work collaboratively with our volunteer committees and boards. Things do take longer at times within the non-profit model, because the volunteers work, teach, attempt to maintain balance with their lives and families, and go the extra mile. Working in collective, rather than ownership, the process can take longer, but we have a lot of input into our decision making and projects. Your contributions in spreading the work, in whatever way, whether with time, intro classes, helping with or teaching classes, providing sessions, creating service projects, gifting monetary grants, committee participation, volunteering locally, benefit all. Join in. As each of us contributes, the whole moves forward and ripples out.

Making a Difference

Lasting contribution: How to think, plan and act to accomplish meaningful work. (Agate 2007) Tad Waddington PhD. I came across this book excerpt in the article Making a Difference, in Spirituality and Health Magazine, March/April, 2009, p. 43-47. The book is on my list to read, and I found the excerpt inspiring.

I've created a quick summary of Waddington's approach that we can apply to our Healing Touch work. He recommends beginning with an "inside out approach" using the word arête or virtue, beginning with excellence in mind, and applying it to the world. This is in alignment with our HTI focus of all things benefitting our vision and mission. He recommends being aware of your "final cause" in order to focus your attention in the right places. I see this in manifestation process as setting your intention and then, as the Native American tradition suggests, throwing the road forward, seeing it as done and following the path.

As we focus on the vision of Healing Touch International, we are Spreading Healing, Light and Love, Creating Wholeness on Earth. All that we do must be in alignment with this long term vision, not just in the HTI leadership, but with you, our members, instructors, practitioners, students and supporters as well.

As we focus on the final cause, with excellence, we begin creating possibilities and flow, opening to new ways. Our healing work clears the energies, and Waddington recognizes the need for clearing the eddies and beaver dams. He suggests we see a "Final Cause of mythic proportions". This can be either personal or professional with the Healing Touch work and for HTI.

The BiHAG

From the same article, Jerry Porras has the following quote from *Built to Last – BiHAG*. He suggests that a "**Big** Hairy **A**udacious **G**oal" gives you the moxie, chutzpah and pluck you need to get a difficult job done... maximizing the quality of the contribution you came to make."

Of course you will need to make a plan, set and meet goals, and then "set sail, go on your odyssey. What is your destination, your provisions, your crew? "A big cause gets you the motivation to get it done." Waddington

recommends that you embody the goal of that which you seek to cause, become the change. If it is self care, personal transformation - model it. Care for and feed your ideas, sacrifice and take action.

Support Groups / Master Minds

Consider using your local support groups in a new way to create empowerment circles, sharing your ideas and final cause or BiHAG, cheering along the progress. The group can offer insights and suggestions, master mind support and help along the way so that you can create lasting contributions.

Rising Above Doubt, Staying in Faith

The article continues to recommend that we "Speak from our hearts, say out loud what we are hungry for, and are willing to live for. Be in thought, word, action, and relationship. We are midwifing a new world into existence. This is our destiny". Collectively we can energetically support our missions, visions and each other either in person or distance to create our collective purpose. The key is to think big, listen in our hearts, feel joy and spread it around, and expand it outward. It continues, "Rise above doubt and pain, be in joy and love. Work from there where miracles happen."

HTI Visioning:

Continuing Janet's Vision and Beyond

We visioned and manifested at the HTI Conference in Tucson. I have heard that many of you have found that suddenly what you manifested has taken on a life of its own and things are expanding beyond your wildest dreams! Great! Keep it up! a neat believable bow. So we decided to give the play 30 seconds of silence. Yep, right in the middle of the action, all those cute little kids on stage in their costumes, the narrator came on and said Einstein's quote about how you can't ever solve a problem from the same level of thought that created it, so we'd better just shut up and meditate for half a minute and see what might show up out of the silence. He rang a Buddhist bell and everything went still. No action AT ALL for 30 seconds. (Backstory.....we spent more time teaching the kids to breath and meditate and follow their internal energy than we did all the song & dance numbers. It was profound.) Thirty seconds is a LONG time for nothing to happen (purposefully) in the middle of a kids' play. After about 8 or 9 seconds, the parents got all squirmy and embarrassed. At 20 seconds the universe started shifting. At 30 seconds the Buddhist bell rang again and the song "Out of the Silence" began. It was, as you can imagine, the most perfect set-up ever. People wept openly. The kids were champs. Nobody cared about the ending to the play; they were all just so beautifully cracked open.

We called the play "30 Seconds." I wish it had made it to Broadway. Maybe someday.....



Healing Partners Celebrates 5 Years of Service

As of its 5th anniversary, Healing Partners has provided free Healing Touch sessions to 175 women diagnosed with breast cancer in the San Francisco Bay Area. Women diagnosed with breast cancer are

paired with Healing Touch (HT) volunteers who provide ongoing sessions for three to six months. Inspired by volunteer programs in Hawaii and Denver, Kathy Turner and Elizabeth Helms created Healing Partners (HP) in 2005 with the backing of Stanford University Medical Center. The program began to bloom thanks to the Creative Awareness Project, a local non-profit organization and grants from the Avon Foundation, Genentech, private donor funding and other support. "It has really been a community manifestation," says Helms.

How Healing Partners Helps

Recipients in the Healing Partners program report that Healing Touch can help reduce some of the side effects of chemotherapy and radiation and speed up recovery from surgery. "I didn't expect to feel anything," says Catherine Palter, an environmental scientist at Stanford University who was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2005. "I almost immediately felt energy flowing through my body. It was like magic. I believe that it is the reason that I fared so well with the side effects and emotional aspects of breast cancer."

For D.J. Soviero, receiving HT was the only time she could just let go and be. Her Healing Partners sessions were like "an island of sanity in an otherwise chaotic existence."

Recipients in the HP program describe how getting a cancer diagnosis is like a double-edged sword. After hearing a devastating physical diagnosis, many feel compelled to be emotionally strong, for family, for children, and friends. One survivor admits that she didn't tell anyone she had cancer because she was afraid they would fall apart rather than give her the support she needed. For her, the reason Healing Partners is so effective is because it supports her on many levels.

It's so Good, Survivors are Becoming Providers

When Catherine Palter entered Healing Partners in 2005, she was paired with provider Margot Baker. She was so impressed with the program that she decided to study HT in order to become a provider in Healing Partners. She has gone on to work with a total of five partners, one of whom is D.J. Soviero (quoted above), who currently is studying HT and intends to become a Healing Partners volunteer in the near future. When D.J. is matched with her first partner, it will represent four "generations" of caring and service. In a recent local Healing Touch Level 2 class, 25% of the students were breast cancer survivors who had recently completed their HP program and who were in class to become Healing Partners providers.



Book Review: the Ethics of Touchrevisited

In 2003, I began reflecting and writing about ethics within the realm of our energy work. These articles, entitled "The Ethics of Touch Series," were printed in our HT newsletters. In keeping with the laws of attraction, I then received a

request to review a new book entitled The Ethics of Touch, the Hands-on Practitioner's Guide to Creating a Professional, Safe and Enduring Practice by Ben Benjamin and Cherie Sohnen-Moe. Taiwan: Touch Your Heart

Upon arrival at the airport in Taipei, I saw a sign that said "TAIWAN Touch Your Heart". I felt gratitude in my heart and knew that was a sign that the people of Taiwan were ready for Healing Touch. The purpose of this article was to present and share how the authors conducted Healing Touch training in a country outside of U.S.

I recently taught two Introduction to Healing Touch and two and a half Healing Touch Level I classes (the second day of the third workshop was cancelled due to a Typhoon) in Taiwan. These were the first Healing Touch classes in Taiwan. I was invited by Assistant Professor Der-Fa Lu, PhD, RN, Healing Touch Practitioner of The University of Iowa,



College of Nursing to travel with her to Taiwan to be the Instructor for these classes. Der-Fa was my interpreter for the entire trip and was a helper for each of the classes. This trip manifested through former graduate students

of Lu's during her teaching years in her homeland of Taiwan between 2001 and 2003. Der-Fa's dream since then has been to take official HTCP Level I classes to her homeland. When I became certified as a HTCP Level I Instructor, it became my dream also. Der-Fa and I became friends during our Healing Touch Level 2A class in 2000.

The classes started forming in March 2008 with the intent of being self-sponsored. Healing Touch was a brand new concept in Taiwan. The cost of living in Taiwan is significantly lower than the U.S., so our initial intent was to model this trip as a volunteer vacation. Der-Fa's family and friends offered us room and board for our 18 day visit. We received funding from different organizations which included the Bureau

of Health in Taitung County. These sponsors almost completely covered our international and domestic travel expenses. The Coordinators for these classes were Molly Mow, MSN, RN and Sho-Hua She, MSN, RN. Der-Fa introduced Healing Touch to Mow and She while she was their academic advisor for their Master's Thesis at Tze-Chi University between 2001 and 2003. Both Molly and Sho-Hua reviewed the teaching material before our arrival. Molly made a wonderful PowerPoint presentation in Chinese for the workshops. Ms. Mow and

demonstrations by students. To teach Healing Touch to large classes, it is necessary for us to activate onsite support. The directors of nursing departments for the second and third workshops participated in the entire workshop. This also provided significant role modeling for students.

This was an amazing and meaningful experience for us, because we were able to take the HTI Healing Touch Certificate Program to Taiwan, and develop personal friendship. We saw that Taiwan was energetically ready and our dream was fulfilled. I learned so much about the culture, food, life style and effect of climate changes in Taiwan (Taiwan was hit by a typhoon which caused the largest flood in 50 years). At the end of the workshops, students were asking when they could take Level 2 training. We intend to organize a distance practice group with them. We will also explore the opportunity to form a chapter of Healing Touch in Taiwan.

INTRODUCTION TO HEALING TOUCH 3 HOUR CLASSES

July 27, 2009 Taipei Municipal Hospital, 8-E General Medicine Unit, Taipei, Taiwan. 12 attended including Head

Nurse: Show-Yen Lee; one retired Nursing Director; six staff nurses; and four persons from the community. This workshop was facilitated by Flack and Lu.



July 31, 2009 Yensen Veterans Hospital,

Yilan, Taiwan. 35 nurses

including Head Nurse Sue Lin, attended the workshop. This workshop was facilitated by Flack and Lu. Following the class Flack and Lu met the Chief of the hospital. Then we toured the mental health department (chronic patient unit and skilled nursing care unit for the elders)

HEALING TOUCH LEVEL I Training Workshops

August 1-2, 2009 Yilan School Nurses Association, Yilan, Taiwan. Eighty-five students received Level I certificates with their Chinese names. There were 84 students from the Yilan district and one student from a neighboring district. This workshop was facilitated by Flack, Lu and Mow. Due to Lu's nursing credential, all participants also received nursing continuing education credits for renewing nursing licenses.





Student PerspectiveA Student's Personal Journey

Several months ago I registered for a Level I Healing Touch Class at Anoka Ramsey Community College. I wanted to take as many of the classes in the Integrative Health and Healing program as I could before graduation or transferring toprofessional school. It has been a very interesting semester and one I would not have really expected.

At the beginning of the semester I really had no idea what Healing Touch was. I didn't know much about energy healing, only what was taught briefly in the Introduction to Holistic Healing class. As a pharmacy student, most of my course work had looked through a skeptical lens at the scientific research behind healing. I came to both the Level I class and to Healing Touch generally very skeptical. I decided that because it was a short class, I would keep my mind open. I also thought to myself that by taking the class I might find some positive information and more likely, reasons to denounce it.

After the first day of the Level I class, I still didn't know what to expect. It seemed like every student knew more than I did but I wasn't sure if I really wanted to know more. The assigned readings helped a little but, in my opinion, were geared for people who already knew about energy work and really didn't go too far to help novices. I was also told to fashion or buy a pendulum, either from stones and crystals or a paperclip on dental floss. At this point I figured I really had signed up for a class in the twilight zone, but I had promised to try it and keep an open mind so I bought some crystals and chain and made a pendulum. I had no clue as to what to do with it once I made it but I did as I was told and even researched some ways to make my pendulum "correctly".

Following the experience of the first weekend where we completed the Level I class, I was far more curious, not totally convinced yet, but definitely curious. I had experienced feelings and sensations I couldn't explain

with my scientific thinking, but I felt them none the less. I tried to stay impartial throughout the weekend, not pushing my mind into believing or disbelieving, but by Saturday evening I was leaning toward one direction and it was not the direction I expected.

My first interventions were done with my family, who I considered "safe" people. As I learned more about it, I started to think Healing Touch wasn't a complete farce, but I still wasn't sure if I wanted to start sharing what I was learning with others. My family was also very skeptical, perhaps more than me as they had not had any of the Integrative Health and Healing classes that I had previously taken. The first time I had an "ah-ha" moment when I was working with my mother. I also saw the effects prominently when working with my guinea pig.

During this semester, I also wrote a research paper on Healing Touch. This helped validate the modality in my mind, and was a wonderful opportunity for me to find the scientific "proof" I was looking for. Not only did I find this research, but I also found that Healing Touch was embraced by several major foundations, hospitals, and universities. This assignment gave me the research I needed to incorporate Healing Touch into my internship teaching project. By this time I had learned so much about Healing Touch that I not only wanted to let people know what I was learning, but to teach them about it also.

Following the Level 2 Class and my internship classes, Healing Touch took a new place in my life. I was asked to work with a few new people who were not family. One of these had never had any energy work done before, but was willing to do anything to help control the pain of a fractured pelvis, as she was experiencing adverse reactions to pain medication. I also was asked to assist at blood drives in my church with Healing Touch, and encouraged to inform more of the congregation that I was a Healing Touch student. Over a few weeks I had gone from a skeptic to a Level 2 student, complete with my own small client base.

While practicing the Level 2 interventions, I had a few interesting experiences that fueled my interest even further. The woman I worked on with the fractured

pelvis told me she had not slept well in days. Once I began the session, she fell asleep before I had finished the spiral meditation opening. Being scientifically oriented, I thought this was because she hadn't slept in a while and fell asleep because of medications. As I continued working on her, I noticed that every time my hands would be working over hers, her hands would involuntarily twitch until I moved on. She woke instantaneously when I grounded her even though I had not touched her.

Following the actual interventions she asked me a lot of questions. I thought this was really the best testament both to what I had learned and to how far I had come personally. For a person who had never experienced any energy healing, something must have happened for her to be so interested following the session. A few days later her daughter informed me that not only had she slept better that night, but she had admitted that, "Yeah, maybe the pain did feel better than before". Coming from a woman who tells it like it is, right or wrong, I knew that something had happened for her in just one session.

Overall, I have enjoyed Healing Touch Level 1 and Level 2 classes immensely and look forward to the possibility of Level 3 being offered through Anoka Ramsey Community College and the Integrative Health and Healing Program this summer. Even if it is not offered through Anoka Ramsey, I would like to continue learning it, even if I have to travel to take the class. I plan to continue with professional school, but I also want to continue learning and practicing Healing Touch. It has been such an interesting journey, going from probably the biggest skeptic in the class, attending as a required part of the program, to making pendulums for other class members, teaching about Healing Touch in my internship project, and offering my services to my congregation both on a personal level and at events such as blood drives. I think I have come further personally in this class than in many of my other classes, both inside and outside of the Integrative Health and Healing Program. It has been a great semester and I look forward to learning more whenever and wherever that happens.

A Practitioner Asks....

Ouestion:

Is having a livable income solely with Healing Touch possible? Who's doing just Healing Touch for a living and what can we learn from them?

How many of us have a practice and possibly a teaching schedule just of HT (and not in combination with other work) that provides an income that is livable? I would like to know who has been successful in creating a full time job of having a solid, good income from which they support themselves fully only using Healing Touch work and teaching?

I haven't met one person yet who only uses HT as their sole means of income. I've met many people who practice HT "on the side" or "part-time", or as an additional modality in their current profession - which is perfectly fine and wonderful. I have met people who say "yes I do have a full time practice" but upon further questioning they have a significant other who shares in the household finances. The question I'm raising is, can HT stand on it's own and is it realistic to have a practice and teaching schedule that provides full time work and salary through HT alone? Is anyone doing just this? I'd like to know. Can it be done by someone who is not in the medical profession? Signed,

Dear Concerned Practitioner/Instructor,

I think this topic is a great idea for our Business Column and I encourage those of you who have been able to make a living with Healing Touch to submit your story so that we can all learn be inspired by each other.

Allow me to introduce myself. My name is Sue Kagel and I am a Certified Healing Touch Practitioner/Instructor, RN, and a Certified Holistic Nurse. I have made a living solely in Healing Touch, with health and retirement benefits, since 1997. As a single mom, without other financial support, I was able to put my two offspring through state college without outside help, (although one had some scholarship assistance).

I'd like to clarify that there are many ways to earn income with Healing Touch, but it often takes creativity and working outside of the box. If we look at a full time Healing Touch private practice in an office as the only way to make a living with Healing Touch, that is limiting. It can be done and I know of several practitioners who have been successful.

My adventure began with a manifestation workshop at the first HTI Annual Conference in 1997, in which I lined out exactly what I envisioned and participated in a manifestation exercise with 400 other conference attendees. I continued to visualize daily without wavering. The vision manifested so rapidly once I did this that it made my head spin! I continue to use this tool today and taught it at our recent HTI Conference in Tucson.

My personal experience has been in integrating my Healing Touch work into my existing place of employment and into other venues that happened along the way. As a nurse, I am employed at Canyon Ranch Health Resort and brought Healing Touch as a separate nursing service through our Medical Department 14 years ago. It took me two years to convince the management to allow this opportunity and a lot of hard work, free sessions, discussions, handouts and support from friends and management. I was able to grow my full time practice within an institution to include 6 additional HT practitioners in the Tucson location and 3 in the Lenox location a number of years ago. At one point we were doing 1,500 sessions a year between the combined properties. I lectured and gave intro workshops weekly or more at times, (still do) and came up with as many creative avenues as I could to keep HT out in front of the staff as well as the clients and the community. Perseverance, creativity, and out of the box ideas for exposure are all key. I include other staff and our Tucson HT Community to get the word out about Healing Touch so that we support each other in our work. We also refer to each other. Exposure is key and needs to be continuous.

I also have had a part time practice at home for family and friends who either paid me sliding scale or bartered with me. In the beginning, this helped supplement my income at work- as I am only paid fee for service. Marketing was a huge part of building the business through networking, lecturing, word of mouth, and hands on sessions for other staff members so that they could speak from their experience or a quick hands on for someone in pain or injury. I now have a very strong following of return guests from years of satisfied customers. I have planted seeds for I4 years and the fruits come in droves. I must continue to plant seeds, and keep it interesting and fresh for me and for my clients. We refer to HTI Practitioners world wide.

I became an instructor in 2001 and taught probably 6 classes a year one year and then had an opportunity to

teach through a foundation to bring Healing Touch to Palo Alto, CA. I taught many more classes per year which helped bring in the extra income to pay for the college expenses. We built a strong community in Palo Alto over several years of teaching. In the process I advanced to teach more levels of classes over the years, which provided more opportunity for teaching.

Through connections and networking, I was invited to collaborate in creating an Energy Medicine online learning program through the University of Arizona Program of Integrative Medicine- Andrew Weil's Program. I have been on faculty there for over 9 years teaching energy medicine and presenting Healing Touch workshops to the associate fellows during residency weeks.

I have also received honoraria for speaking on Healing Touch and holistic nursing (for which I have a certification) at various national conferences.

The interesting thing is that I didn't go looking for any of this. I would pray every day and stand in my healing room with this mantra: "Let me be of service and bring those who I can assist in their healing. In return, I ask the universe to provide for me and my family so that I can provide this service, pay the bills, pay for education, retirement and some left over for a bit of fun and travel! We have a deal.

Do I lead a charmed life? I worked extremely hard to create my Healing Touch business within the Canyon Ranch umbrella. I always say I don't work for Canyon Ranch, I work for the universe and I'm stationed there at the moment. From that base, the rest of this has flowed - with a lot of hard work and follow up. My motto is "This or something greater, for the highest good of all. Let me be of service and receive abundance in return." I do believe that it is possible to do earn a living as a non-medical person as well. My profession as a nurse was where the doors opened for me, but I had to keep knocking.

What is your success story? We all have a variety of ways in which we incorporate this work. Please share your vision and mission with us so that we may all expand in our Healing Touch work.

Words of Wisdom "Words"

The devastation in Haiti and Chile and the deepeness of the winter season upon much of the Northern Hemisphere offers an opportunity for internal reflection. Where is the light, the heart's desire? It may be found in the light of day, the light of knowledge and the light of healing. Light is how we walk our path on this planet. We, as healers, have chosen to embrace it and work with it. Our task is to be in the light and offer it for others.

I chose to select the topic of "words" and then search through Janet's writings and sayings about how to use words. I believe that our information age has called upon us to be aware of the right use of words. When I was traveling with Janet and immersed in her teachings, I was very aware of the power of words both said and those left unsaid. How Janet used words in and out of the classroom was what I tried to capture. One of my tasks was to understand the energy of words. I began to realize that words could not be erased once said, nor discarded and cast aside. Once spoken, words are like a delicate glass ornament placed in your hand. Others liken words to an arrow, in that once released, they can never be recaptured. Janet's gift to me was her words.

The importance of taking care with words is evident in Janet's telling me how she had one time been attacked verbally at a meeting of colleagues. She said it was as if "they actually threw something at her heart." She then explained how those around her set about protecting her from the words and anger of the others. This story provided me with a heightened respect for the power of words and also made me realize that being in truth and integrity does not protect you from the attack of others.

anet also had a principle about the use of words, that being one of simplicity. She said in White Shadow, "Don't use too many words. We are to bring them to the work through invitation.....if you talk too much, you are only imparting ten percent of what you know." She believed that her job was to respond to questions and once a question was asked, to answer but leave the person looking for more. Maybe this advice came from the guidance that she wrote about in her journal in 1993, in which she was told in guidance to "adhere strictly to the guidance given you by your teacher regarding the economy of words. In any situation where there is controversy, the less said, the better. Guard your words as well as your thoughts. Stay quietly centered and you will be much more helpful to others. There is no need to create stress, for stress is already present. What is missing is the quiet calm and peace in the situation. Notice how others respond and are

caught up in the drama. Create no drama, but create a calm presence and a quiet voice."

She was given further advice to continue to work on language and to "counter controversy without getting emotionally swept up in it. The word cooperation instead of competition is an example of changing a word to connote a different concept", she was told. And she was instructed to "simply stay informed and speak only dispel the nature of any serious misinformation. It is much better to state in positive terms what you do and let go of any tendency to argue your point."

A nother aspect of using words is to do so in a way to create healing, not harm. In the year 2000 at the Healing Touch International, Inc. conference on the beautiful island of Kauai, Janet was honored by personal audiences with Satguru Sivaya Subramuniya-swami who was affectionately known as Gurudeva, a Hindu minister and revered teacher. Janet shared with me that she had read his book Merging with the Shiva (1999) a daily meditation guide. In these writings, he offered this advice; "Judge every action that you make, every word that you speak, with this law: Is it true? Is it kind? Is it helpful? Is it necessary?" (p. 53)

uilding on this theme is a discussion on the use of B words by Rabbi Joseph Telushkin in Words that Hurt, Words that Heal, in which he talks about the Jewish law of lashon ha-ra. It is considered a very serious offense when one disseminates accurate information about someone that will lower the status of the person and is often referred to as "negative truths". That means that we are, as healers, called to a higher order of understanding about the use of words and careful attention to how our words could affect others' beliefs about the person we are talking about. Further, if one discloses "facts" that are only hearsay, the damage one inflicts may be devastating and irrevocable. Rabbi Telushkin suggests that if you are going to say negative things about another (for example, gossip) to limit this to a very small number of people (i.e. your partner) and "develop a way of talking about others that is as kindly and fair as you would want others to be when saying things about you that, though true, are not complimentary." (p. 45)

When at all possible, do as Janet was directed and use the simplicity of words to "move into the heart energy and let it radiate from your center. See the light and watch the light as it comes from you. When this light emanates from you it becomes a magnet that attracts others to the light and it can be shared."

Research

Greetings! I am very busy becoming acquainted with my various roles as Director of Research; a huge thanks to Diane Wardell for her generous assistance and time spent in orientation. Please know that I am more than willing to assist members with research projects, so do not hesitate to contact me with questions.

This month, I'd like to share the results of an interesting study with you. The study was conducted by Deborah Lallier,

ThD, CHTP, CHt as part of her doctoral work. The purpose of the study, "An Integrative Process Embracing Heart Centered Consciousness," was to examine relationships between consciousness and well-being/health. Lallier's study was based on Richard Gerber's notion that health of the body and consciousness are integrally related, as well as Abraham Maslow's concept of self-actualization as the highest level of human development. "Holistic wellness" levels were measured in this study using the following instruments: a) physical levels (Symptoms Index); b) physical/emotional levels (Profile of Moods States™); and Emotional/mental/spiritual levels (Personality Orientation Inventory).

Deborah Lallier developed a method of measuring the location score of the Core Star™; Core Star™ assessment scores were obtained by Certified Healing Touch Practitioners also trained in energy observation. According to Lallier, the location score is considered to be a reflection of the current level and stage of consciousness through which an individual is presently operating. Holistic wellness scores on the physical, emotional, and spiritual inventories were correlated with Core Star[™] location scores to determine relationships between health and level of consciousness. As predicted, higher location scores were correlated with higher wellbeing scores. In particular, the variable related to decreasing tension and anxiety within the mind/body, as well as variables related to the process of self-actualization, were found to be significantly correlated with higher location scores. Selfactualization variables found to be positively related to location score included ability to live in the moment, selfregard, self-actualizing values, and capacity for developing intimate relationships with other human beings that were unencumbered by expectations and obligations. Correlations were also found between Core Star[™] demographic factors of age, length of time practicing HT, and level of HT training, which suggest a maturational effect of giving and receiving HT. The location scores found for the participants in the study denoted placement between the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} chakras; the higher the location may indicate a trend away from the egocentered consciousness level of the lower chakras toward a more heart-centered consciousness. Lallier concluded that her results support her model that health can be viewed as a

consequence of increasing consciousness (and reconnection to one's spiritual core) within the mind/body.

Congratulations to Lallier for her challenging and thoughtprovoking work. The results make me wonder if she has found support for a related theory from nursing, Margaret Newman's (2000), Health as expanding consciousness!

Instructor Alliance Committee

The Board of Directors created the Instructor Alliance Committee in April 2008 as a forum for HTI Instructors to communicate with each other and with the HTI Board, and to receive Instructor-oriented information in a timely manner. This was created as a one-year pilot program.

This committee served a vital communication role during 2008-2009, and helped many creative ideas bubble up from Instructors. The Instructor Alliance participated in the development of Student Solutions for those wanting to pursue HTI certification when not all their classes were HTI classes. They also generated the idea of non-residential and three day Level 4 and Level 5 classes. Both these ideas made it possible for many people to pursue certification with HTI.

The Board of Directors has reviewed the committee functions with Maggi Hutchinson and Lynne Jeffrey, the Co-Chairs of this group, and are in consensus that the committee has served its purpose and goals so it is time to dissolve this committee. The prior functions have evolved so that they are now accomplished through our Instructor E-zines, the ability for Instructors to communicate ideas and issues in a more efficient manner to HTI Board members by email at board@HealingTouchInternational.org, and by instituting two Co-Facilitators for each class level for Instructor curriculum communications. These new innovations provide a good information flow to Instructors, and a way for Instructors to continue to circulate their ideas.

The Board offers sincere thanks to the Instructor Alliance Committee members, and Co-Chairs, Maggi and Lynne. They all are examples of heart-centered living manifested through loving service. The members of the Instructor Alliance Committee:

Stepping out into the Unknown — Creating a Project

I began my journey by discussing with my practice group that I was working on a community project. I asked them to save the date and that I would give further details when I got it all worked out. It was a Level 4-5 community project and I had no idea where to begin or how to proceed.

I was not sure just how to present an HT community project and decided that I had to take the first step. I made a phone call, introduced myself, and asked if I could bring Tucson Healing Touch to the Tucson, AZ Community Wide Welcome Home OEF/OIF Warriors, sponsored by the Community of Tucson and Southern Arizona Veterans Administration Health Care System (SAVAHCS) event and provide mini HT sessions. All the while I was praying and yet, I prepared myself to be turned down. What joy to hear "yes you can have a booth". The event was scheduled for October 17, 2009.

The Project

Healing Touch was provided in chairs by a group of volunteers to Veterans from all the eras and their families, active duty members and their families, and SAVAHCS staff members and their families, including kids. HT was the last booth to close. When we finished, literally all the other booths were empty and taken down; the field was empty.

In the parking lot we were stopped by various vendors

Clinical Application Working with Individuals Post Prostate Surgery

The purpose of this column is to bring forth new uses of our Healing Touch work or combinations of techniques that seem to be working successfully for specific issues, so that other practitioners can field test the suggestions. If we find that a protocol works well, this may lead to a pilot study for a research project. Please consider submitting your findings for specific issues, so that we can all try them and see if they are consistent.

Removal of Prostate Robotically

I recently had the pleasure of working with two clients who had undergone nerve sparing robotic surgery for prostatectomy (removal of prostate gland) due to cancer. While this is a very small sample, I did find some significant results in just a few sessions and felt called to share this information. Unfortunately, in my work setting I don't have the ability to follow up long term as the "guests" are in our setting for a finite period of time, usually a week. My sense is that if I had been able to see them longer term, the results would have continued in an even more significant manner. I leave those opportunities to you.

Significant Issues Related to Prostate Surgery

In prostate surgeries, whether standard, for hypertrophy (enlargement) or nerve sparing removal, complications arise. These may include: urinary incontinence, erectile dysfunction (ED), and self esteem issues. Procedures vary depending on the instruments used for the surgery. It is important to understand the surgical procedure as there are 5 puncture wounds from the robotic instrument stabilizers inserted into the abdomen in addition to the incision into the abdomen for the actual removal. These vary in location. There are also major tracks inside the abdomen from the instruments traveling around which disrupt the abdomen and the energy field. Clients are often treated with a stimulation type drug like Cialis or long acting versions in a low dose in order to stimulate blood flow to the surgical area and assist in healing and restoring function. Both clients were taking related medications; Client A was daily and Client B was a long acting version.

Anatomy

I followed our usual protocol with an intake that I kept very clinical, technical and sensitive in discussion, allowing the clients to take the lead. I asked appropriate questions about function, and about the emotional aspect as well, how they were coping with the diagnosis, healing

process and resulting life changes. The pre-treatment energetic assessment in both revealed a considerable amount of congestion, stagnation and thickness in the pelvic region. It is important to recognize the anatomical location of the prostate- about I finger length from the pelvic floor and located behind the pubic bone. The prostate, the size of a walnut if it is not enlarged, is distal or below the bladder neck so when it is removed. the opening sphincter to the bladder is traumatized from the surgery and also from the indwelling catheter which can press on the nerves, creating a loss of control of urine. The nerves that are related to erection are attached to the prostate on either side and need to be peeled away from it in the nerve sparing procedure. They are traumatized in the process, even though "spared". Sometimes the nerve on one side is also removed.

Client A was 3 weeks post surgery and had issues with urinary incontinence and ED. Client B was 2 years post operative, had minimal issue with incontinence in the beginning and resolved. He had a more invasive procedure and continued with ED.

Mutual Goals - Client A – relieve incontinence, decrease ED. Client B decrease ED.

Interventions

- I) **Wound Seal** all entry wounds and incisions to prevent further energy leakage while doing full body work.
- 2) Chakra Connection (Level 1-2 students) or Chelation preferable. (Level 3 and above students) These are Interventions to either open and balance, or deeply clear the area and charge the field.
- 3) Hand above and below the 2nd chakras to clear the area and increase energy flow. These chakras are related to the reproductive organs.
- 4) Discuss with the client that you would like to slide a hand under the very low back so that you are opposite the pubic bone, and place the other hand above the pubic bone- but not touching the body on the front, to increase the energy flow in the pelvic region. Make sure that you are several inches

above the body to avoid touching and let the client know it may feel like touch from the energy, but is not. Invite them to look at your hand position for comfort and trust. This technique is to further energize the area.

- 5) **Ultrasound to the pelvic region**, especially area above and around the pubic bone and down toward the pelvic floor, being careful of privacy areas and keeping several inches distance.
- **6) Hands in Motion** to clear the congestion from Ultrasound.
- 7) **4 finger laser moving** from the hip bones (Iliac crest) sweeping slowly down toward and over the pubic bone without touching. Create a V shape through the abdomen and through the area of the bladder and prostate.

Moving laser is helpful to break up congestion and assist in nerve healing. Because the nerves are no longer attached, their location is uncertain. This will insure that the area is addressed for the nerves as well as the bladder neck and bladder corresponding nerves.

8) **Double Hand Boost** (Level 1-2 students) or **Cone – (preferred)** (hands cupped inward to direct the energy to a specific point) (Level 3 and above) directed over the pubic bone area, and above it in the low abdomen. Also include the root chakra aiming from the knee area to keep privacy distance.

You will need to move and reposition your hands to about 3 places to cover the area. I find that if I am sitting at the side of the table, and I rest my forearms on the right hip bone (iliac crest) or thigh, I can keep my hands steady in the off the body position and not fatigue, so I can stay in the position longer. It also seems to have less of an invasive feeling for the client coming in from the lateral (side) aspect and helps them identify where my hands are located.

Outcome

The client A, whose issue was incontinence, was seen 3 times over 2 weeks. Prior to the first session, he was using a form of incontinence padding that was saturating. After the first session, the incontinence was down to a very low level. After the 2nd session, he was able to function without padding and seemed to be having some

return of erectile function in sleep - which is the first to come back. His energy had also significantly picked up and he was walking every morning.

The Client B was 2 years post surgery. He was treated 3 times in one week, two days in a row and then again a few days later. After the first session as above, his sexual function, which had been mostly dormant, increased and while not sustainable for long, was a significant change. This was with the medication taken that morning. After his second session the next day, functioning level continued, even though he was not due for the medication until the next day. After the final sessions, I don't have follow up as they returned home.

Homework

In Client A, the case of incontinence and ED, we focused homework on continuing the Kegel exercises (note spelling) that had been prescribed by their medical practitioner prior to position changing from lying to sitting or sitting to standing, as that was when he noticed the most leakage. He was to Kegel (which is a squeezing of the pelvic floor as if to hold back urine, and continue to tighten the muscles up into the belly) several times, and then hold that position while arising from sitting or standing. He had been doing the exercises since surgery, but not specifically when changing position. This helped immensely. He was free of any incontinence or padding from that point forward.

For those clients who have not had Kegel exercises prescribed, it is important that they check with their medical practitioner before beginning this or any other additional physical activity.

Both clients were taught Healing Touch techniques of Ultrasound, and double hand boost with the hands cupped inward to form a cone. This was to be done to the pelvic region where I had lasered and done the cone as well. I taught with demonstration and return demonstration. I also taught the spouse of one of the clients so that she could continue to be supportive and assistive at home without feeling awkward.

I share this with the intention that it is a useful protocol for others assisting clients post prostate surgery. If you find this useful and we find that many are experiencing similar results, or with modifications, experiencing even more significant results, please write it up for clinical application so that we can take this information to the next level.
