Letter from the Editor

Seeds, Eggs, Sperm and Harvest

Eggs

I have been reflecting for some time about a curious juxtaposition that occurs in nature. Human female babies are born with every egg (or ovum) that they will ever have. The formation of these eggs in the ovaries begins during embryonic development while the baby girl is growing and “gestating” in utero. The eggs are held in a state of “suspension” until the girl reaches puberty. At that time, the eggs fully mature during the menstrual cycle and are released from the follicle in preparation to be fertilized and create a full human being. The sperm that fertilizes this egg are produced by the father and take approximately 2 ½ months to mature. Once released, they then can live on average from 3 – 4 days, until fertilization of the egg occurs.

Preparing the Way

When we draw back and look at the bigger picture, we realize that the unique egg that created and became you was present in your mother's body when she was a fetus in utero during your grandmother's pregnancy. In other words, a very important aspect of you was with your mother, when she was developing in the environment that your grandmother was providing during her pregnancy, and that your grandmother was experiencing during her pregnancy. My mother was born in 1929, several months following the time of the great Wall Street Crash which heralded the Great Depression in the USA. We could then consider that the egg that created me was energetically present in 1929 through today. My grandmother died when my mother was 15 but she was an important holder of the environment that contained an aspect of me. She prepared the way; she nurtured not only the next generation (my mother) but the generation following (myself).

Anchoring the Present

In startling contrast, the sperm that was contributed by my father represented a time span of approximately 2 ½ months from the time of production within my father to the time of conception and was anchored very much within the “present” time of my birth year.

So, what does this have to do with us, and what indeed

might it have to do with this particular issue of HTI's Perspectives in Healing, in Part 3, of our exploration of our theme, Healing and Our Infinite Potential?

Space Time Travelers

When we look at the process of conception and fetal development from an energetic perspective, **our parents have contributed the means by which we can travel multi-directionally in space and time, while remaining anchored solidly in the present.** The energetic mind stream of the mother has the ability to influence the future before it happens, while carrying the lineage from her grandmother's past, while the energetic mind stream of the father continues to hold our consciousness firmly in the present. It is through holding the qualities of both the female and male parent, that we are able to ride the flow of time while remaining centered and grounded in our daily lives and our healing space.

Infinite Potential

It is also through holding the qualities of both parents that we can begin to create, envision, and enact our infinite potential, while still remaining in our present time and drawing from the creative energy of the earth. It is how we can travel through time and envision and dream of a better future and allow the steps to be revealed that will help us achieve that goal.

Mentoring the Future - The Next Generation

It is also through these qualities that we create the archetype for the mentorship process. Just as our grandmothers and mentors traveled forward and backward in time, we too reach back into time, gathering and drawing upon the wisdom of those that came before us, bringing this wisdom and experience into the present, and gifting it onward to future generations. The environment that we create for this work to unfold, plants the seeds for future generations, who will travel back in time to touch us even as they move into the future, *Spreading Healing Light Worldwide, Creating Wholeness on Earth.*

Community Development

Growing a Healing Touch Practice Group

Remember the feeling you had at the end of your first Healing Touch class? How excited you were about learning HT and how much you wanted to go out and use it? Most students need support in nurturing and developing their new skills, and a Healing Touch practice group is the perfect way to do that.

Because practice reinforces the techniques and keeps the energy flowing, students are encouraged to do the techniques for themselves as well as with family and friends. However, an ideal way to practice is with a group where participants both give and receive HT sessions. The group also provides a supportive environment which nurtures the student. Below you will discover the benefits of joining a practice group followed by tips on how to organize one in your area.

The Benefits

- 1. Reviewing techniques and sequences** If you haven't done HT in a while, a practice group is a good way to reconnect with the energy and jump start your practice. If you are a little rusty on the techniques, request a short review before the exchange sessions begin.
- 2. Receiving a session** Receiving a one hour session is relaxing, and it allows you to experience the work of others. You will learn as much from receiving as giving. Even though HT techniques are standardized, the touch and flow of energy will vary from practitioner to practitioner. While receiving, you can observe how each technique affects your own energy field. I never fully understood the value of Magnetic Clearing until I experienced the full 30 passes done very slowly following a Chakra Connection in the course of a one hour session. Receiving a short session is simply not the same.
- 3. Documenting a session** For apprentices working on their Level 4 assignments, attending a practice group has two extra advantages. Not only does it fulfill the support group requirement, but you get to document a full session.
- 4. Asking questions** After sessions are completed, time is allowed for questions and discussion. From listening to the experiences shared by advanced students and practitioners, you will begin to understand the nuances of selecting techniques and how your choice affects the flow of energy and the outcome of the session.

- 5. Having fun** Practice groups make it easier to stay motivated and excited about doing Healing Touch. It's fun to share what you love doing with like minded people and feel supported in your work.



Making Practice a Priority

Reserve practice dates and times on your calendar six months in advance and make a commitment to attend. On the day of practice, your mind may generate thoughts such as "I'm too tired," "I can't remember the techniques," or "It's too dark or too cold outside." Simply notice these thoughts and turn them into reasons for attending. Tell yourself, "I'm going to practice tonight to review the techniques, feel energized and meet some really nice people." Then observe how you feel at the end of the practice. Remember that feeling for the next time the excuses arise.

Organizing a Practice Group

When it comes to practice groups, the more the merrier. If you would like to start a group in your area or add another group that meets at a different time or place, here are some tips to get you started:

- 1. Recruit a coordinator** Look for someone who is enthusiastic, loves Healing Touch, sees the value in practicing and has a little time. Recruit some helpers, too, for small tasks and to cover when the coordinator can't be there.
- 2. Find a venue** Churches, hospitals, schools and private homes are all good locations. Try to find a place that has massage tables. If not, consider using banquet tables and having participants bring foam pads and pillows for cushioning.
- 3. Schedule a regular day and time** Try to schedule the same day and time each month such as the 2nd Tuesday at 7pm. Keep in mind that most people work on weekdays so the best times for practice are generally in the evenings or on weekends. Select a schedule that accommodates as many people as possible.
- 4. Send out reminders** Have either the coordinator or helper send out an email about two weeks in advance detailing when and where the group will meet. Be sure to collect everyone's email address,

and let them know to look for the reminder. You might also consider asking for an RSVP, especially if you need to arrange for tables.

Practice Group Agenda

Begin the practice by asking each attendee to introduce themselves and identify their level of practice. Follow with announcements about upcoming HT classes or events. Then ask if anyone would like to have a technique or sequence demonstrated. After the demo, have a short meditation to ground and center the group before selecting practice partners. Then it's off to the tables for an exchange session. Allow time to conclude the meeting with a short debriefing when questions can be addressed.

A practice group is an essential tool for growing your Healing Touch community. Join or start one now!

HTI Guidelines

Healing Touch Practice Groups and Public Clinics, 12/04

Practice Groups:

Student practice groups have been a byproduct of the continuing education curriculum program of Healing Touch and have ranged from informal trades by several students to actual regularly scheduled group practice meetings. In essence, any number of students can informally gather and practice the interventions that they have learned within the classes. When available, CHTPs or CHTIs have at times helped the students in these practices to cultivate their skills.

The following are **recommendations** that could be helpful in establishing and conducting student practice groups:

Student Practice Groups:

1. Students agree by consensus to practice in accordance with the HT Standards of Practice, Scope of Practice and Code of Ethics guidelines, and sign a statement acknowledging that they have read these documents and agree to conduct themselves in accordance with these documents.
2. There is an "open door policy" in that any sessions within a practice group are either

in a large room (as in our classrooms), or if individual treatment rooms (less ideal), the door is to remain open at all times.

3. Each individual is to use the standard curriculum for their guide: either the textbook or syllabus.
4. Students practice only those HT techniques for which they have received training via a Certified Healing Touch Instructor.

Public Clinics: (The practice group opens its services to the public)

1. Numbers 1-4 recommendations listed above are enacted.
2. There is on-site supervision by a CHTP having legal scope to practice within that state. It is important to recognize that this CHTP is responsible for monitoring that the group follows the curriculum guidelines.
3. Client signs statement acknowledging confidentiality and clients rights/responsibilities.

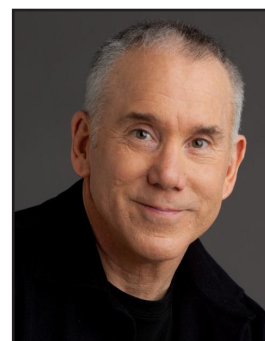

Mentorship

Bumps in the Road!

unexpected “bumps in the road”! This article is written to address these “bumps” and suggest ways to deal with them in your mentorship relationship.

One of the most important things for a successful mentorship is a relationship between mentor and mentee that is open, honest and trusting. It is important for the mentee to feel comfortable sharing with their mentor and never be afraid to disclose life changes that may interfere with the desired timeline and goals. Life happens! Things change! But, if the relationship is strong, the mentorship can adjust to the needs of the mentee and still be active until the mentee has had the space to get back on track with goals, intentions and homework completion.

The mentorship requirement for certification is one year. However, we have had situations of mentees taking 2 or more years due to life situations that have come up. Delays are not a reason to dissolve the relationship. However, the expectations may have to be adjusted. Perhaps for a period of time the meetings may need to cut back to once every other month or every 2 - 3 months rather than monthly. It doesn't feel good for a mentee to meet with their mentor every

Mentorships generally start out with great enthusiasm and clearly set goals. These usually include finishing all the Level 5 Homework within the next year to allow the HT Practitioner Apprentice to attend a Level 5 about a year following their Level 4 class. However, we have found over the years of mentoring, that there are sometimes

month if they really don't have the opportunity to do any treatment sessions, receive any modalities or write any educational reports. It is better to be honest and say – “I need to take a little break until my life shifts a bit”.

One of the most important recommendations for both mentee and mentor that we can make is to stay in communication with each other! The Mentorship Guidelines do state that the mentee will be in contact with their mentor by phone, email or by meeting at least once a month. We get most frustrated when a mentee doesn't communicate for 3 - 6 months without letting us know what is happening with them! If regular monthly appointments are set up with each meeting, this usually doesn't happen as then the mentee can honestly look at their situation and tell the mentor that they need more time between.

The HTI-Practitioner Apprentice year is one of incredible growth! We usually tell students at Level 4 to “fasten their seatbelts”! But, if that growth involves challenging life changes, we want to support mentees in ways that will keep them coming back in time to complete the goals.

Healing Touch with Guided Imagery for PTSD in Returning Active Duty Military: A Randomized Controlled Clinical Trial. *Military Medicine*, 177, 9:1015, September, 2012. Official Publication of Association of Military Surgeons of the U.S.

The findings of this randomized controlled trial to determine if Healing Touch and Guided Imagery reduced PTSD symptoms as compared to standard treatment in returning combat-exposed active duty military with significant PTSD symptoms showed statistically and clinically significant reduction in PTSD symptoms as well as depression, significant improvements in mental quality of life and cynicism.

The Generations of Mentorship

They were pairing off in the circle.

But it didn't feel right; I had connected with the class, but I didn't feel a personal affinity with anyone to select a mentor. And then from across the room, next to the Level 4 instructor, my eyes met with a sage woman. One I had admired throughout the class. I was the 'odd number out' selecting a mentor, but it was a perfect match: the class assistant Jan Manthey.

This is the story about mentorship, but perhaps not the one you think.

My mentorship experience with Jan was magical. As a nurse she had the expertise and perspective I lacked as a layman. Her gentle soul allowed a space for learning laced with strong and unrelenting support. She offered her home in another state as a refuge to review my documentation and provided guidance and compassionate critique.

Our official relationship ended too quickly. Even though it was a relief to complete the certification process, I began to miss our regular mentorship appointments. To Jan's credit we continued to stay in touch to update each other on our Healing Touch practices and our lives.

Fast forward five years.

As I mentioned, Jan and I did not live in the same state. And as the Universe would have it, my daughter, Kelsey, decided to go to college, not only in the same state as Jan, but the same town. And the same University where Jan works.

My husband and I were surprised that our daughter chose such a large school. Even though she went to a high school with close to 2,500 students, we felt her personality was more focused on a few really good friends in a smaller environment. But she chose what she wanted and we embraced her preference.

The transition wasn't easy. Academically she was doing great. Socially she felt overwhelmed. We would Skype a lot that freshman year, talk on the phone and would visit her as often as we could. I encouraged her to join groups, volunteer, and reach out to meet new people. She did all of those techniques to feel more comfortable in her surroundings. It worked, but not to the level that would really support her.

When my daughter was accepted to Jan's University, I of course, emailed her. She was delighted, and being who she is in the world, suggested we all get together when we dropped Kelsey off to school, or when we visited her.

After my daughter was at school for a few months, I reached out to Jan. Would she be willing to perhaps email or call Kelsey and help her feel more at home? Jan immediately responded with a resounding, "yes!"

Jan did more than just email her. She invited her for dinner. They watched football games together. She would call her and take her out to lunch. Kelsey fell in love with her dog, Tazzy. Jan would share her favorite spots in town. And when Kelsey wasn't feeling good, Jan offered sound medical and Healing Touch guidance.

Jan embraced our daughter and gave her the connection she needed to excel in school. Her generous spirit softened the realities of living on your own for the first time, a challenging school curriculum and developing new relationships. What a gift Jan is to me, my daughter and my family.

The next generation of mentorship lives on.

Janet Mentgen, our founder, was an unassuming woman to see. She was of short stature with short brown hair. She insisted instructors wear name tags so that they would not be mistaken as students as she had once been. Yet, in 1985, in her journal writings, she identified herself as a “beginning mystic”.
